Estimated Ripe Date	Name	Description	Appearance	Good For
Late Aug.	William's Pride	Firm, crisp, juicy and moderately sour but sweetens with age.	Red / Purple	
	Paula Red	Not too sweet or tart. Firm, fine-grained texture. Great for sauce.	Red / Yellow	
Early Sept.	Zestar	Extremely crisp and juicy, similar to Honeycrisp. Great eating apple.	Green / Red	
	Blondee	Crisp and juicy. Mild sweet with little or no acidity. Similar to Gala.	Yellow	
	Ginger Gold	Fine textured, sweet and mild-tart finish. Similar to Golden Delicious.	Green	
	KinderKrisp	Very crisp and sweet similar to Honeycrisp. Great for the lunchboxes!	Small, Red	
Early Mid- Sept.	Chestnut	Crisp, juicy, and very sweet firm flesh. A good cider apple.	Small, Bronze	
	Crimson Crisp	Crisp with a sweet yet spicy taste.	Red	
	Honeygold	Sweet, honey taste without any tartness. Milder than Golden Delicious.	Yellow	
	Sansa	Crisp, sweet-tart flavor with a firm flesh.	Red / Yellow	
	Summer Rambo	Crisp, mildly-tart flavor and is great for sauce. Shorter storage life.	Green / Red	
	Gala	Mild-sweet flavor. Thinner skin than most. Stays firm in baking.	Yellow / Pink	
	Mollies	Juicy, mild-sweet flavor. Crisp, coarse-grained texture.	Pink	
Mid- / Late Sept.	Wealthy	Juicy and soft, but not mushy. Many say it's the best pie apple.	Red / Green	
	Ambrosia	Crisp, sweet, and low acidity. Remains white for longer after cutting.	Pink / Orange	
	Cortland	Juicy, crisp, and a mild-sweet flavor. Great for baking.	Crimson Red	
	McIntosh	Juicy, crisp with a sweet and slightly tart flavor. Great for baking.	Crimson Red	
Late Sept. / Early Oct.	Honeycrisp (in store)	Extremely crisp, juicy and sweet. Great eating apple.	Red / Green	
	Black Twig	Tart, firm, and juicy cider apple. Flavor enriches when refrigerated.	Dark Red	
	Empire	Firm, juicy, crisp, and sweet.	Bright Red	
	Macoun	Firm, juicy, sweet, and aromatic. Similar to McIntosh in flavor.	Bright Red	
	Snow	Tender, spicy refreshing flavor. Snow-white flesh.	Small, Crimson	
	Snowsweet	Crisp, snowy-white flesh with an almost 'buttery' taste.	Small, Red	
Early / Mid-Oct.	Wolf River	Very large apple with a sweet tart flavor. Keeps its shape when cooked.	Very Large	
	Golden Delicious	Firm, crisp, and juicy. Careful, they bruise easily. Stays firm in baking.	Yellow	
Mid- / Late Oct.	Jonagold	Crisp and juicy with a tangy-sweet flavor. Stays firm in baking.	Yellow / Green	
	Connell Red	Crisp, juicy and mild sweetness.	Bright Red	
	Enterprise	Spicy flavor that becomes pleasantly tart in storage. Thicker skin.	Crimson Red	
	Hardy Cumberland	Firm, crunchy and sweet, with moderately low acidity.	Green / Red	
	Ida Red	Firm, crisp and juicy, with a tangy flavor. Stays firm when cooked.	Deep Red	
	Melrose	Firm, juicy, and a slightly acidic sweet-tart flavor. Excellent for baking.	Yellow / Red	
	Northern Spy	Crisp, juicy, and a sweet-tart flavor. Many say "Spies are for pies."	Green / Red	
	Red Delicious	Thin, bright-red skin with a mild flavor and fine-grained flesh.	Heart Shaped	
	Red Yorking	Sweet, juicy, firm, and stores well.	Red	
	Rome Beauty	A good cooking apple, retaining its shape when cooked. Thicker skin.	Red	
Smokehouse	Crisp, sweet, and a slight malty cider flavor. Keeps well in storage.	Yellow / Red		

The following areas on the map contain a mix of trees and may have very limited apple availability. Tree quantities listed may not be exact.

Mixed Area #1: (Row 5) 3 grafted trees-DO NOT PICK, then there is 1 Paula Red, 2 McIntosh, 16 KinderKrisp
(Row 7) 5 McIntosh, 4 Crimson Crisp, 5 Snowsweet, 12 Sansa
(Row 9) 2 McIntosh, 8 Crimson Crisp, 4 Snowsweet, 13 Smokehouse

Mixed Area #2: 1-2 trees of Chestnut, Red Yorking and Hardy Cumberland.

Mixed Area #3: 1 Jonagored, 2 Enterprise.
